STORY: Transformed by Crisis Response

As the COVID-19 crisis unfolded, churches from Liberty County Responds took action to meet the community's needs in various ways. One church, Liberty Church of Christ, used its community food bank to serve families both physically and spiritually. Volunteers put in extra time to keep up with the demand for food.
